The Licence Controllers Certificate is a must-have qualification, if you want to work in the hospitality industry, especially if you are planning to manage or own a business. You can not attain your Managers Certificate without this qualification. Choose to further your study as this LCQ training programme covers the theory component of the Managers Certificate. Brief Programme Outline

You will cover all the theory based aspects of LCQ on this course. You'll gain an in-depth knowledge of the Sale of Liquor Act 1989 and an understanding of the implications of the Act for licensed premises. You will also gain knowledge of key Host Responsibility requirements under the Act as a liquor license controller.

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This qualification has been developed by the hospitality industry to improve the quality and skills of staff in licensed premises. You will gain and be asked to demonstrate your knowledge of a manager's responsibility to meet legal requirements for licensed premises including on licenses, off licenses, club and special licenses.

The course includes the following unit standards:

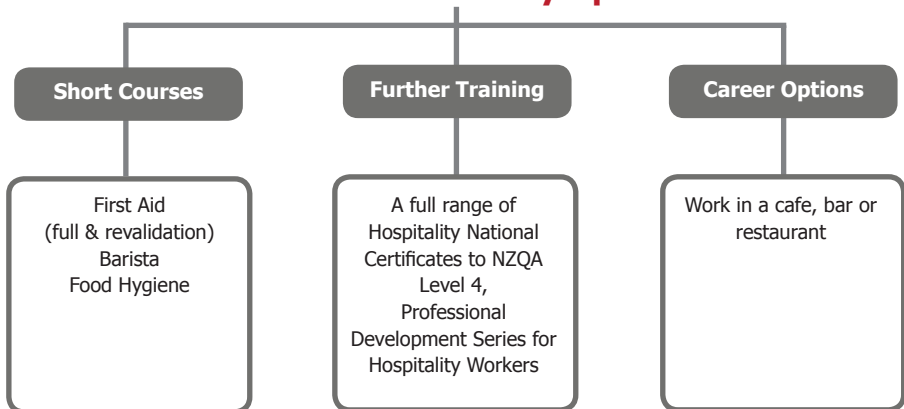
- **Unit Standard 4646:** Knowledge of the Sale of Liquor Act 1989 and the implications on licensed premise operations.
